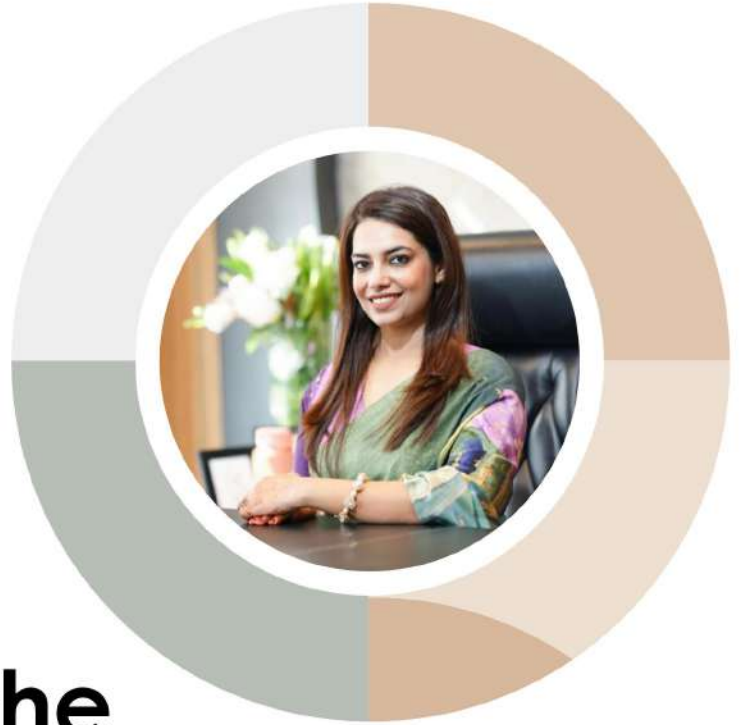

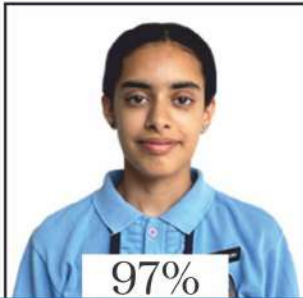

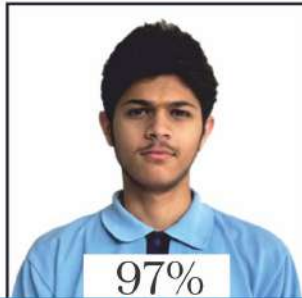

# CURBING YOUR SWEET TOOTH!

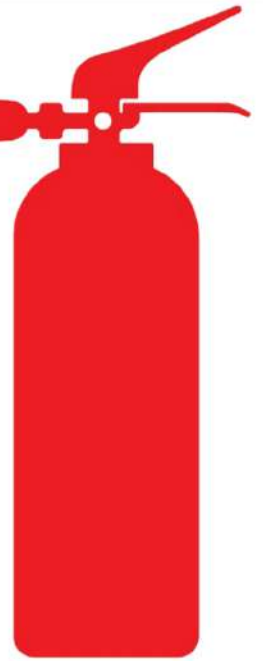


In keeping with the CBSE guidelines which emphasizes on a balanced diet for students while limiting unhealthy fats, Doonians learnt important lessons from Dr. Sophia, Dentist on Nutrition. She gave useful tips on making healthy choices while limiting sugar and unhealthy fats. She raised awareness among the students about the influence of sugar and oral hygiene on our overall health. She further said that, consumption of sugar and sugary foods negatively impacts students' oral health, leading to dental caries (cavities), which occur when oral bacteria feed on sugar and produce acid that erodes tooth enamel. This can result in pain, school absence, and other health issues, especially if students consume sugary drinks and snacks between meals or regularly. Dr. Sophia encouraged students to prioritize regular brushing, flossing, and dental check-ups. She emphasized that good oral hygiene habits can significantly reduce the risk of dental problems.

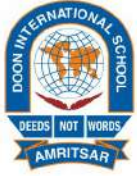

#### **Camps and Trips**

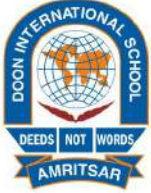

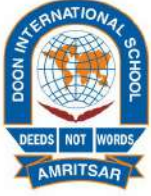
